Any person who believes that he or she has been aggrieved by an unlawful discriminatory practice under Title VI has a right to file a formal complaint with The Road Home. Any such complaint must be in writing and filed with The Road Home Title VI Coordinator within one hundred eighty (180) calendar days following the date of the alleged discriminatory occurrence. For more information, please contact The Road Home's Title VI Coordinator. Complaints may also be filed at the local level, with the Utah Transit Authority's Title VI Administrator.

ADA/504 Statement:

Pursuant to Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Section 504), the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) and related federal and state laws and regulations, The Road Home will make every effort to ensure that its facilities, programs, services, and activities are accessible to those with disabilities. The Road Home will provide reasonable accommodation to disabled individuals who wish to participate in public involvement events or who require special assistance to access The Road Home facilities, programs, services. Because providing reasonable accommodation may require outside assistance, organization or resources, The Road Home asks that requests be made at least five (5) calendar days prior to the need for accommodation.
